


LYNN WOODS RESERVATION NORTH SIDE BOULDERING MAP

HOW TO USE THIS MAP

The bouldering development at Lynn Woods is still in its infancy, yet there are already hundreds of established problems. Some of the 150+ boulders on this map have never been climbed and others are rarely visited so the boulders are classified by their potential for development. If a boulder is known to have at least one classic problem, the boulder is given a "High Potential" rating. "Low Potential" boulders are unlikely to have a classic on them, but you never know. These classifications assume that the boulderer using this map can climb in the V4/V5 range and that they have an eye for identifying classic lines.

Trail mileage is denoted when the trail section is at least 0.1 miles long. Trail Junction Markers (e.g. ) are small, blue plaques found in trees at some trail junctions. These numbered markers may be missing or difficult to spot.

SIZE

Lynn Woods is the 2nd largest municipal park in the entire U.S. The park area is over 2200 acres. The north side of the park, shown on this map, is roughly 800 acres so be ready for an adventure in nature when searching for any of the 150+ boulders shown on this map.

AREAS

The first character of each boulder label corresponds to the bouldering area that the boulder is a part of.

B - Bikini Bottom
F - Fenway
G - Goliath Rock
K - Kahlenberg
N - Nature Valley
O - Overlook
R - Bow Ridge
S - Mount Spickett
W - Weetamoo

Weetamoo, Mt. Spickett, and Nature Valley have the highest concentration of classic problems.

DIRECTIONS TO LYNN WOODS

Most of Lynn Woods is located in Lynn, Massachusetts. From Route 1 in Lynnfield, take the exit for Route 129/Salem Street and head east towards Lynn for about 0.7 miles. At the rotary, take the first exit for Route 129/Lynnfield Street into Lynn. After about 2 miles, take a right onto Great Woods Road. The parking lot is at the end of the road. Have fun and be safe!

THE MAP DATA

Shaded relief, aerial photos, topography, streets, water features, and power line data layers were obtained from MassGIS and then edited for accuracy. Boulders and trails were mapped using GPS technology and aerial photos.
